Does how we treat the world matter?

What will I learn this year?

- How Christians believe the world was created. They will learning about the Story of Genesis.
- Why Christians might think it is important to look after the world.
- Talk about why our planet should matter to all humans – and how this should influence our behaviour
- Learn how and why Christians might thank God for creation at Harvest festivals
- reflect on their own use of the world's resources and ask questions about what they can do to show that they care about the world

Key Vocabulary

Creator- Someone who makes things.

Bible- A book made up of the writings that Christians believe came from God.

Humans- people, a person.

Harvest- gather crops.

Influence- power to change something or someone



What should I already know?

- know that Christians refer to God as 'Father'
- why Christians might compare God to a loving parent
- how and why Christians might want to talk to God (prayer)
- suggest symbolic meanings of rituals and items used in Christian prayer
- The importance of love in families and ways in which they are cared for and supported by family members
- discuss who they can talk to when they are happy/sad/worried

What will I learn next?

- know that the Abrahamic faiths believe in prophets
- identify Christian beliefs and values contained within stories of the prophets (eg. Noah, Abraham, Moses, Jonah)
- suggest why these prophets chose to listen to and follow God
- identify Christians who might be described as people who listened to and followed God
- describe how and why some Christians might devote their lives to serving God
- talk about what is meant by a sense of vocation
- identify inspirational people/role models for the world today
- describe the qualities that inspirational people might have
- Consider who makes a good role model and why
