He created the Julian Calendar, which is what the calendar we use today is based on. • The Romans invaded and conquered many countries in Europe before heading to Britain. • Boudicca was a queen of the British Celtic Iceni tribe who led an uprising against Roman occupied towns and cities. • The Romans left their mark on Britain leaving us new towns, plants, animals, religion, and ways of reading and counting. • Hadrian's Wall – A long wall built by the Romans across the north of England. Conquer	To get or overcome by force.		
Emigrate	To leave one country or region in order to settle in another.		
Immigrate	To come to live permanently in a country where one was not born.		
Gladiator	A man in ancient Rome who fought other men or animals, often to the death, to entertain an audience.
