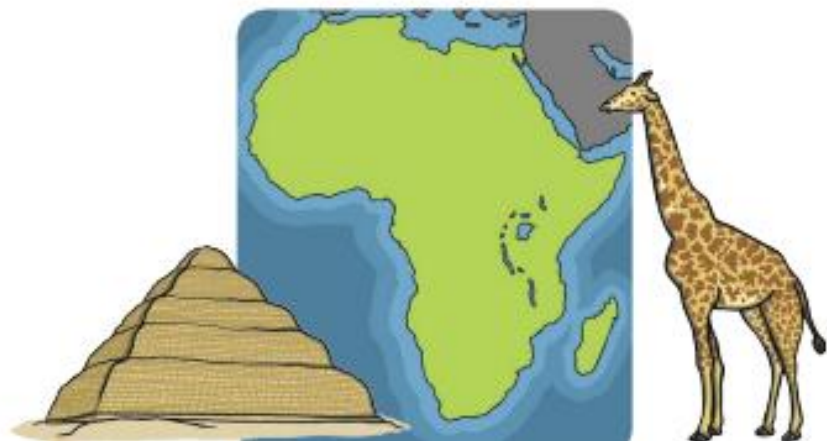

- 101 whale squirting water from its blowhole.
